














Farm Visit Scavenger Hunt

How many can you find before it's time to head home?

-  **A tractor** - parked or moving, both count
-  **A barn cat** - they're usually around somewhere
-  **The biggest vegetable on the property** - everyone agrees on the winner
-  **A piece of equipment you can't name** - ask a farmer what it does
-  **Something that really smells** - you'll find it
-  **A cow, goat, or sheep** - up close, not just from a distance
-  **A baby animal** - chick, lamb, kid (goat), or calf
-  **Something still growing in the ground**
-  **A spider web** - in the barn, on a fence, or in the grass
-  **A weathervane** - on the barn roof
-  **The best-looking thing to pick** - apple, berry, pumpkin - you pick it
-  **One thing that surprises you** - something you didn't expect to find

Weekday farm visits skip the weekend event surcharges that can double the admission. Buying from the farm stand usually gets twice the produce for the same price as the grocery store - and you picked it yourself.
